




Sarah Anna Glover (1785-1867) Norwich Sol-fa method




John Curwen (1816-1880) Tonic Sol-fa method








### Khasi and Jainta Hills District

• Published *Solfa bu* (Sol-fa Book) c an instructional method book with vocal exercises in the Lushai (Mizo) language first published in **1910**, later reprinted as *Mizo solfa bu* (Mizo Sol-fa Book) in **1923**.








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


#### Lushai Hills District

Rev Frederick Savidge (1857-1935) and Rev James Lorrain (1870-1944) – Baptist Missionary Society

Rev David Jones (1870-1947) and Rev Edwin Rowlands (1867-1937) — Welsh Presbyterian Mission

 Published numerous hymn books with Lushai words and with Tonic Sol-fa notation from 1899.







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
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





Many Mizos loved to sing, and they found happy companions in the missionaries who came to live in the hills. Quite a few were from Wales and had been sent out by churches with strong choral traditions. Singing became equally essential [to playing instruments] in the churches of Mizoram. As a Governor of Assam, in inimitably essentialist terms, once put it: "The Welsh have a special affinity for the Lushais as the Lushais are as musical as they are." Soon choirs were formed, and these became a fixture of social life that persists today.






### Mizo Tonic Sol-fa Text and Hymn Books


- Hla sak zir dan a Tonic Sol-fa instructional text, in **1927** and **1928** which was re-published in 1935 by the Loch Printing Press in Aijal (Aizawl).
- *Hla leh Solfa* a selection of songs in Sol-fa notation, printed by the Loch Printing Press in **1935**.
- *Hla lawrkhawn a solfa nen* a selection of twenty-one songs in Sol-fa notation, printed by the Loch Printing Press in **1937**.
- Hla leh Solfa (Songs and Sol-fa) produced for the Synod of Churches in 1938.
- Solfa zirna bu 1-na (Book 1 of a Tonic Sol-fa instructional method) and
- Solfa zirna bu 2-na (Book 2) published in 1938 initially as single books and from **1948** as a combined book; this publication was re-printed several times during the **1950s** and **1960s**.











# Conclusion
